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## Introduction

This document provides the template for the development of the Case Studies on digital transformation in libraries.

The ADELE project aims to contribute to the internationalisation of organisations that choose a path of digital transformation. Through the network they can connect, collaborate, compare, and exchange ideas with organisations across Europe and beyond.

Description of the experience: aim, methods and outcomes	<p>Despite the shared border and common history between West Bohemia and Upper Palatinate regions, no common database existed to enable the connection between the Education and Research Library of Pilsener Region and State Library Regensburg concerning a potentially shared topic. This project aimed to address this gap, which was achieved at three fundamental levels:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Access to collections related to the Upper Palatinate and Western Bohemian regions;</li> <li>2. Catalog linking of participating libraries;</li> <li>3. Involvement of other relevant educational and GLAM (Galleries, Libraries, Archives, and Museums) institutions.</li> </ol> <p>The project's main output is a linked catalog that enables systematic searching on specific topics, including digitized historical materials.</p>
